



Eric Wen is a long-time community leader in the Greater Toronto Area. He was one of the founders of the Chinese Canadian Conservative Association on January 27, 1983. He has served on the CCCA board for 31 years and is still an active board member.

For over 30 years, Eric Wen has also founded and/or has actively served on boards for over 20 organizations including:

- The Chinese Association of Mississauga, as a board member for 27 years and the current president;
- The Chinese Community Centre of Ontario, as a board member for 23 years and the current vice-president;
- The Peel Multicultural Council, as a board member for 23 years and the 2011 past president;
- The Canadian Multicultural Council, Asians in Ontario, as a founder and board member for 16 years;
- Lions International, as a two-time District A711 6A zone chair;
- The Ontario Film Review Board, as a board member from 2002-2004.

Due to Eric Wen's vast contributions to the communities of the Greater Toronto Area, he was awarded both the Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Medal, as well as the Diamond Jubilee Medal.
